Hi There,

I am the deputy headteacher at Saltash Community School. I am getting in touch to see what help/support I can give. As an organisation, the bridge is a significant concern for the school as it can delay staff and seriously affect the ability of staff to arrive on time, many of whom, including me, have children, so do not have the option to leave earlier due to childcare drop-off times.

Many staff live in Plymouth. Part of my job is to ensure we have enough staff to ensure the safe operation of the school. Given the latest news of yet more delays, I am having to work on a contingency plan for times when staff are unavoidably late, due to the bridge.

Additionally, recruitment is affected by the bridge as candidates almost always raise a concern about the delays and cost.

I myself have to leave work earlier than I want to to ensure I can pick up my children on time, often meaning I cannot be in work until 5pm, which impacts my job.

I am sure I can lend some weight to the argument somehow and would be keen to help if I can. Could you please let me know what I can do?
